What is the Summer Institute?

As a site of the National Writing Project, our Summer Institute offers you a place to read, discuss, and share ideas about teaching writing---plus time to write.

Readings may include common and grade-specific readings to meet the needs of all teachers participating in the institute.

Teachers also share best teaching practices and explore the teaching of writing by writing.

Summer Institute participants receive a stipend to cover the cost of tuition, books, materials, library privileges, and a supportive community of fellow teachers. Institute fellows are also eligible for four (4) graduate credits in English or Education.

The University of North Dakota requires all participants to be admitted to UND and to register for the institute (graduate credit or audit).

Once participants are selected, the RRVWP assists in the application and registration process. The stipend is designed to reimburse participants for the cost of tuition and fees.

Who Can Participate?

Any teacher of any subject, at any grade level, is welcome. If you are interested in the effective teaching of writing, you should apply.
